Parent conferences are two weeks away. Next week we will include question suggestions for you to ponder. Happy Friday.

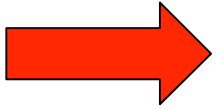
VETERANS DAY ASSEMBLY

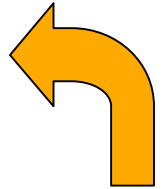
CHARACTER DRESS-UP DAY
